



Sacrifices Made By Him...



→ Lahore Central Jail: Bhagat Singh was initially arrested on charges of involvement in the Assembly bombing incident in Delhi in 1929.

→ **Mianwali Jail:** Bhagat Singh, along with Sukhdev and Rajguru, was kept in Mianwali Jail during the trial for the murder of John Saunders, a police officer, in December 1928.

→ **Lahore Central Jail (Second Term):** After the murder of J.P. Saunders, Bhagat Singh and his associates were brought back to Lahore Central Jail. It was from this jail that they were taken to the gallows on March 23, 1931, and executed.

Sacrifices Made By Him...



→ **Hunger Strike:** Bhagat Singh, along with his fellow revolutionaries, staged a hunger strike in the Lahore Central Jail to protest against the inhumane treatment of political prisoners. They demanded better living conditions, food quality, and the classification of political prisoners separately from common criminals. Their hunger strike began on June 15, 1929, and lasted for 116 days.

→ **Hanging:**

Bhagat Singh, the revered Indian freedom fighter, was hanged on March 23, 1931, in Lahore Central Jail. His execution, alongside Rajguru and Sukhdev, for their role in the struggle against British colonial rule, left an indelible mark on India's fight for independence, inspiring countless others to continue the struggle.


